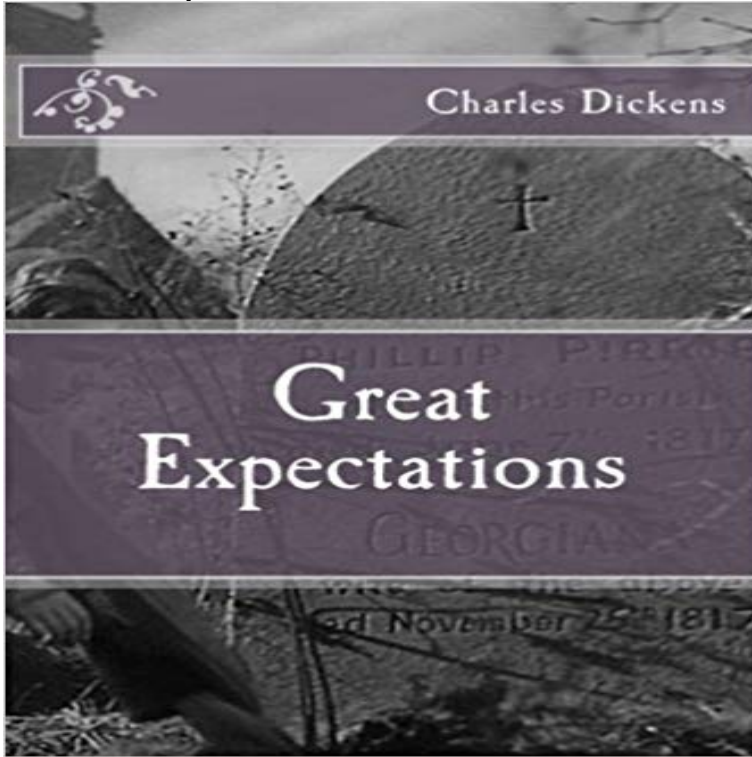


Great Expectations
